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Mylan Classic Announces Additions to the 2011 Tournament Field

Participants to compete in the second annual Mylan Classic

CANONSBURG, Pa.—Officials from the Mylan Classic announced today that three members of the Tri-State PGA Section have qualified for the 2011 tournament through the Seven Springs Open. Additionally, the National Golf Association's Hooters Professional Golf Tour has been granted an unrestricted exemption into the tournament's 2011 field.

"We are excited to announce that the Tri-State PGA Section and National Golf Association's Hooters Professional Golf Tour will be represented in this year's Mylan Classic," said Chase McClain, tournament director of the Mylan Classic. "As the tournament grows, so too do the opportunities to support the game of golf and the players that aspire to earn membership on golf's greatest stage."

On Monday, Adam Corson (Dick's Sporting Goods), Bob Ford (Oakmont Country Club) and Kevin Shields (Sewickley Heights Golf Club) qualified for the Mylan Classic at the Tri-State Section's Seven Springs Open. Corson, who shot a 5-under par 66 placed first in the qualifying event while Ford and Shields finished at 68 and 70 respectively. Shields also qualified for the Mylan Classic last year at the Tri State Section's Tam O'Shanter Open with a round of 67.

"Adam played extraordinarily well today considering the very difficult Seven Springs course," said Dennis Darak, executive director and CEO of the Tri-State PGA. "I know that each of the professionals who qualified will be great additions to the Mylan Classic field."

The NGA Hooters Tour is the third largest men's 72-hole professional golf tour in the U.S. behind the Nationwide Tour and PGA TOUR and has helped hundreds of professionals acquire membership on the PGA TOUR, Nationwide Tour and Champions Tour. The exemption into the Mylan Classic will be granted to the NGA Hooters Tour's leading points winner over the course of five events to be held in Greenville, S.C., Asheboro, N.C., Hawkinsville, Ga., Mobile, Ala., and Biloxi, Miss. Notable NGA Hooters Tour alumni include: Kevin Kisner (2010 Mylan Classic champion), Jim Furyk, Lucas Glover, Zach Johnson, Ben Curtis and David Toms.

"The No. 1 goal of The NGA Hooters Tour has always been and always will be to help professional golfers achieve their dream of playing on the PGA TOUR," said Robin L. Waters, NGA Hooters Tour president. "Golf is a game of opportunities and by earning the exemption for the Mylan Classic, we are opening a door to give one of our players an opportunity to hopefully fulfill those dreams."

As a community event, the Mylan Classic offers both championship golf and entertainment for the whole family. Weekly tournament tickets for the Mylan Classic are priced at \$25 and include admission for the tournament itself as well as concerts by Jerrod Niemann, Steel Magnolia, Scott Blasey, Joe Grushecky and The Spinners. Also scheduled for tournament week are the Youth Clinic presented by Highmark, Women's' Golf Clinic presented by Washington Hospital, pro-am events, and a Military Appreciation Day.

Tournament tickets are being sold through a unique and innovative initiative known as the ANSYS TICKETS Fore CHARITY™ program. Through this program more than 150 participating non-profit organizations are selling tickets and retaining 100% of the proceeds as well as a percentage of the \$35,000 bonus pool. The Mylan Classic is part of the PGA TOUR's 26-event Nationwide Tour in 2011. It will be held Aug. 29 to Sept. 4 at Southpointe Golf Club in Canonsburg, Pa. The event will draw 156 Nationwide Tour professionals from as many as 20 countries vying for one of the 25 PGA TOUR cards that will be awarded to the leading money winners at the end of the year. Also descending on Washington County during tournament week will be the players' families, caddies, pro-am participants, corporate guests, television crews and other news media, PGA TOUR staff members and thousands of spectators. Golf Channel will televise all four rounds of the Mylan Classic in the U.S. Internationally, it will be distributed via the PGA TOUR to 72 countries and territories, including Japan, China and parts of Europe and Latin America.
